12th Annual Stand Down Helped 600 Veterans and their Family Members

WORCESTER, MA – Veterans Inc., in cooperation with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, U.S. Department of Labor, and other local agencies, supported 600 veterans and their family members at the 12th Annual Stand Down held June 16.

The one day event included 82 providers that assisted with career opportunities, counseling and substance abuse referrals, employment and training, health and wellness, housing referrals and resources, legal services, Registry of Motor Vehicles, and much more. Free items and services included new clothing and footwear, food and refreshments, haircuts, personal care items, and much more.

The event had opening remarks made by Worcester County District Attorney Joseph D. Early and Worcester City Councilor Morris A. Bergman, Chair of the Veterans' & Military Affairs, the national anthem performed by Catherine Parrotta from Boston 25., and former Boston Bruin and now WAAF radio personality Lyndon Byers signed autographs.

"More than 6,000 veterans and their families have received assistance at Veterans Inc. Stand Downs since the event's inception in 2006", said Vincent Perrone, Veterans Inc. President & CEO. He went on to say, "We remain grateful for the outpouring of community support, as this event would not be possible without their generosity."

"By participating in the stand down, Suzanne and I were not only able to see first hand the scope of the needs that some of our veterans have but also the enthusiasm and desire of so many people willing to help them get to a better place. According to the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans, the Stand Down was "a safe retreat for units returning from combat operations" where troops had access to clean uniforms, warm meals, medical and dental care, mail, and camaraderie, all in a safe environment.
